The **Easy Velvet Infinity Scarf Crochet** Pattern uses just 1 skein of Bernat Velvet yarn. The velvet yarn is so soft and luxurious. It makes such a soft and cozy winter scarf. It's made with all half double crochet in the back loop only. This adds just a little bit of texture while still keeping it an easy pattern.

### <u>Materials</u>

1 skein Bernat Velvet K/6.5 mm hook yarn needle scissors

## <u>Level</u>

easy

### Pattern notes & stitches to know

ch - chain

hdc - half double crochet

hdc blo - half double crochet back loop only

- written in US terms
- ch 2 does not count as hdc
- This scarf is worked in rows. Then the ends are sewn together to make an infinity scarf.

Approx finished size (before sewing): 11.5" x 58"

# EASY VELVET INFINITY SCARF CROCHET PATTERN

Ch 37

**Row 1**: hdc in the 3rd ch from the hook and in each ch across (35 hdc)

**Row 2 - 75**: ch 2, turn, hdc first stitch, hdc blo in each stitch across to the last, hdc in last stitch (35 hdc)

Fasten off. Leave a long end for sewing.

Bring both ends of the scarf together. Sew them together with a whip stitch.

Weave in the ends.
