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The **Carson Crochet Dress Pattern** is a pretty spring dress! I designed this dress for my daughter Carson. She had a lot of say in the design of her new dress. She wanted it pretty, pink, and ruffle-y. This dress is written in 5 kids sizes: XS (5), S (6/6X), M (7/8), L (9/10), XL (11/12)

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Materials

Lion Brand Big Scoop in Strawberry (1 skein for 5 & 6/6X, 2 skeins for 7/8, 9/10, & 11/12)

G/4.0 mm hook

yarn needle

scissors

stitch marker

Level

intermediate

Pattern notes & stitches to know

ch - chain

foundation sc (alternatively you can make a ch and sc into the ch)

sc - single crochet

2 dc CL - 2 double crochet cluster (*yarn over, insert hook into stitch, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops*, repeat from * to * one more time in the same stitch, yarn over, pull through all loops on hook)

Approximate Finished Size:

Chest: 5 (26") 6/6X (27") 7/8 (28") 9/10 (29") 11/12 (30")

Width across the back: 5 (13") 6/6X (13.5") 7/8 (14") 9/10 (14.5") 11/12 (15")

Armhole: 5 (5.25") 6/6X (5.5") 7/8 (5.75") 9/10 (6") 11/12 (6.25")

Length: 5 (23") 6/6X (24.5") 7/8 (26") 9/10 (27.5") 11/12 (29")

Gauge: 18 sc x 22 rows = 4" x 4"

Written in US terms

CARSON DRESS CROCHET PATTERN

Pattern written in 5, 6/6X noted in (), 7/8 noted in [], 9/10 noted in { }, 11/12 noted in < >

Round 1: ch 2, starting in the 2nd ch from the hook, foundation sc 60 (66) [72] {78} <84> (or you can ch 61 (67) [73] {79} <85>, sc in 2nd ch from the hook and across) (60 (66) [72] {78} <84> sc)

This dress is worked in the round without joining. Do not join to the first stitch, but begin round 2 by working into the first stitch. Place a stitch marker in the first stitch of round 2.

Round 2: sc in each stitch around (60 (66) [72] {78} <84> sc)

Move the stitch marker to the first stitch in the next round. Continue moving the stitch marker each round.

Round 3: sc in 8 (9) [10] {11} <12> stitches, 2 sc in next, ch 2, 2 sc in next, sc in next 9 (10) [11] {12} <13> stitches, 2 sc in next, ch 2, 2 sc in next, sc in 17 (19) [21] {23} <25> stitches, 2 sc in next, ch 2, 2 sc in next, sc in 9 (10) [11] {12} <13> stitches, 2 sc in next, ch 2, 2 sc in next, sc in remaining stitches (68, (74) [80] {86} <92> sc)

Round 4: *sc in each stitch to the ch 2 space, (sc, ch 2, sc) in ch 2 space*, repeat from * to * around, sc in remaining stitches (76 (82) [88] {94} <100> sc)

Repeat round 4 (each round will increase by 8 stitches) to **Round 22 (23) [24] {25} <26>** (220 (234) [248] {262} <276> sc)

The sleeves are created in the next round

Round 23 (24) [25] {26} <27>: sc in each stitch to the ch 2 space, sc in ch 2 space, ch 3, sc in next ch 2 space (*skipping an entire side, this will be the first sleeve*), sc in each stitch to next ch 2 space, ch 3, sc in next ch 2 space (*this is the second sleeve*), sc in remaining stitches (122, (130) [138] {146} <154> sc)



Round 24 (25) [26] {27} <28>: sc in each stitch and ch around (128 (136) [144] {152} <160> sc)

Round 25 (26) [27] {28} <29>: sc in each stitch around (128 (136) [144] {152} <160> sc)

Repeat previous round to **Round 30 (32) [34] {36} <38>** (128 (136) [144] {152} <160> sc)

Round 31 (33) [35] {37} <39>: 2 dc CL in each stitch around (128 (136) [144] {152} <160> CL)

Repeat previous round to **Round 62 (66) [70] {74} <78>** (128 (136) [144] {152} <160> CL)

Round 63 (67) [71] {75} <79>: hdc in 2 stitches, sc in 2 stitches, sl st in next, *skip 1 stitch, 6 dc in next, skip 1 stitch, sl st in next* repeat from * to * around, join to first beginning of the round (*this does not have to work out perfectly*)

Fasten off, weave in the ends. When weaving in the first end, sew the little gap closed.

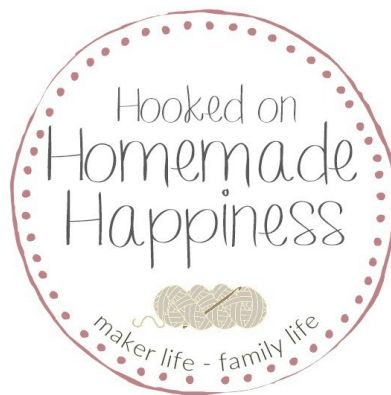
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
