Thank you for your purchase!! I named this cardigan the Shelly Cardigan because of the pretty shell pattern. This cardigan can be dressed up or down. I used an acrylic yarn, but I think a cotton would work wonderfully and be great for summer!

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Materials

198 - 396 yards worsted weight acrylic or cotton yarn (I used a little over 1 skein of Yarn Bee Soft Secret in Mist)

5.0 mm hook

Scissors

Yarn needle

Level

Intermediate

Pattern notes & stitches to know

Sl st - slip stitch

Ch - chain

Dc - double crochet

Sc - single crochet

Pattern is written in small, medium is noted in (), and large is noted in []

Finished Size—measurements are approximate

Small

Width: 17.5 inches

Length: 19 inches

Medium - noted in ()

Width: 20.5 inches

Length: 21 inches

Large - noted in []

Width: 23.5 inches

Length: 24 inches

Pattern

V stitch - dc, ch 3, dc

Shell - (dc, ch 1) 4 times + dc

Ch 61 (71) [81]

Row 1: in 8th chain from the hook work (dc, ch 3, dc), *ch 1, skip 4 stitches, (dc, ch 3, dc)* repeat from * to * to last 3 ch, skip 2, ch 1, dc in last chain (11 v stitches, (13 v stitches), [15 v stitches])

Row 2: ch 3, turn, shell in each ch 3 space across to the last v stitch, skip ch 1, dc into next chain (11 shells, (13 shells), [15 shells])

Row 3: ch 4 (counts as dc + 1), turn *v stitch in 3rd dc of next shell, ch 1* repeat from * to * to last shell, dc in top of ch 3 from previous round (11 v stitches, (13 v stitches), [15 v stitches])

Repeat rows 2 & 3

For small: to row 22

For Medium: to row 24

For Large: to row 26

Or until desired length

Now you will start working on one of the front panels

Row 23 (25) [27]: ch 4 (counts as dc + 1), turn, *v stitch in 3rd dc of next shell, ch 1* repeat from * to * across the next 5 shells (6 shells) [7 shells], dc3tog across last dc in current shell and first 2 dc's in next shell (5 v stitches, (6 v stitches), [7 v stitches]) *photo on next page*

Row 24 (26) [28]: ch 3, turn, shell in each ch 3 space across to the last v stitch, skip ch 1, dc into last stitch (5 shells, (6 v shells), [7 shells])

Row 25 (27) [29]: ch 4 (counts as dc + 1), turn, *v stitch in 3rd dc of next shell, ch 1* repeat from * to * across, dc in top of ch 3 from previous round, (5 v stitches, (6 v stitches), [7 v stitches])



Repeat pattern

For small: to row 44

For medium: to row 48

For large: to row 52

Or until desired length

Ch 4, turn, *sc in 3rd dc in next shell, ch 3*, repeat from * to * across, dc in top of ch 3 from previous row

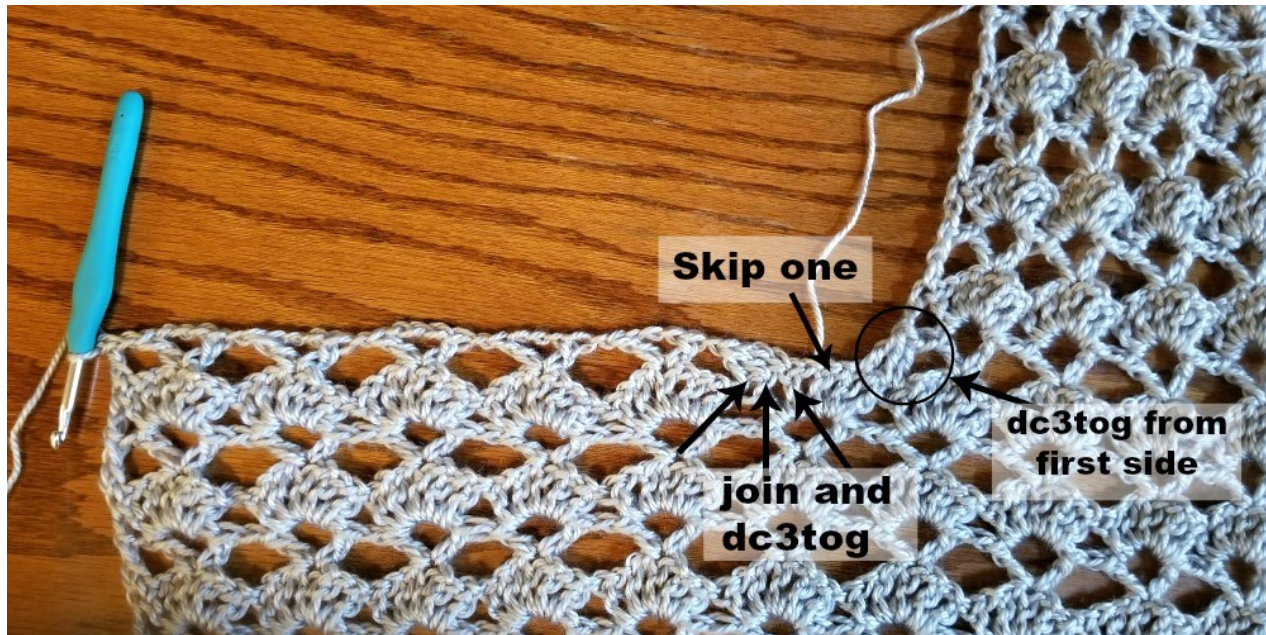
Fasten off, weave in the ends.



Now you will work on the second front panel.

Turn work so the finished front panel is on the right. You will work in the center shell with your dc3tog in row 22, (24), [26].

Row 23 (25) [27]: Skip one stitch, join yarn, ch 3, dc2tog, ch 1, *v stitch in 3rd dc of next shell, ch 1* repeat from * to * across, dc in top of ch 3 from previous row (5 v stitches, (6 v stitches), [7 v stitches])



Row 24 (26) [28]: ch 3, turn, shell in each ch 3 space across to the last v stitch, skip ch 1, dc into next chain (5 shells, (6 v shells), [7 shells])

Row 25 (27) [29]: ch ch 4 (counts as dc + 1), turn, *v stitch in 3rd dc of next shell, ch 1* repeat from * to * across, dc in last stitch, (5 v stitches, (6 v stitches), [7 v stitches])

Repeat pattern

For small: to row 44

For medium: to row 48

For large: to row 52

Ch 4, turn, *sc in 3rd dc in next shell, ch 3*, repeat from * to * across, dc in top of ch 3 from previous row

Fasten off, weave in the ends.



Fold front panels down on top of the back, wrong side out (there isn't technically a "right" side, just whichever side you like best)

Using a piece of yarn twice the length of the area you want to stitch and your yarn needle, whipstitch the sides closed. Leave room at the top for armholes.

Fasten off, weave in all the ends.

Turn right side out.

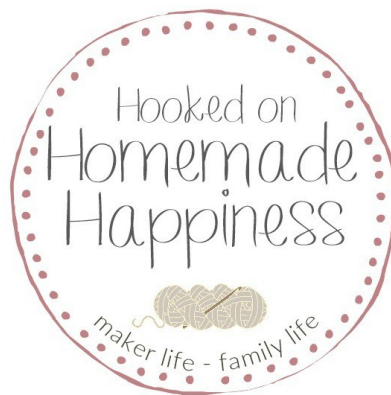
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
