That 70's Sweater Crochet Pattern is a cozy turtleneck sweater that requires no sewing! This sweater is a raglan style that starts with the turtleneck and works down.

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Materials

Worsted weight yarn (pictured is Caron Cakes in Buttercream) - approx 450g for S, 600g for M, 775g for L, 950 for XL

J/6.0 mm hook

H/5.0 mm hook

Yarn needle

Scissors

Level

Intermediate

Pattern notes & stitches to know

sl st - slip stitch

ch - chain

Foundation dc

hbdc - herringbone double crochet - yarn over, insert hook into stitch, pull up a loop, pull first loop on hook through second loop, yarn over, pull through 1 loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops

hbdc2tog - herringbone double crochet 2 together - yarn over, insert hook into stitch, *pull up a loop, pull first loop on hook through second loop, yarn over, pull through 1 loop*, yarn over, insert hook into next stitch, repeat from * to *, yarn over, pull through all loops on hook

Ch 2 does not count as stitch

Written in US terms

Pattern notes cont.

Approx. Finished Size

Bust: S (36") M (40") L (44") XL (48")

Width across the back: S (18") M (20") L (22") XL (24")

Length (including folded turtleneck): S (21") M (22.17") L (24.5") XL (26.25")

Armhole: S (8.5") M (9") L (9.5") XL (10")

Sleeve Length: S (22") M (23.75") L (25.5") XL (27.25")

Gauge (with H/5.0 mm hook): 11 hbdc x 8 rows = 4" x 4"

THAT 70s SWEATER

With J/6.0 mm hook ch 3

Row 1: starting in 3rd ch from the hook foundation dc 42 (48) [54] {60}

NOTE: If you don't want to use foundation dc you can ch 44 (50) [56] {62}, dc in 3rd ch from the hook and across. But this will make the turtleneck opening tighter

Check that this fits over your head, if not continue to increase the hook size until it fits

Join to first dc to make a loop

Row 2: ch 2, turn, hbdc in each stitch around, join to first stitch with sl st (42 (48) [54] {60})

Repeat round 2 to **Round 7** (42 (48) [54] {60})

Change to H/5.0 mm hook

Repeat round 2 to **Round 12** (42 (48) [54] {60})

Round 13: ch 2, turn, *hbdc in 2 stitches, 2 hbdc in next* repeat from * to * around, join to first stitch with sl st (56 (64) [72] {80} dc)

Round 14: ch 2, turn, hbdc in each stitch around, join to first stitch with sl st (56 (64) [72] {80} dc)

Round 15: ch 2, turn, hbdc in each stitch around, join to first stitch with sl st (56 (64) [72] {80} dc)

Round 16: ch 2, turn, hbdc in 6 (7) [8] {9} stitches, 2 hbdc in next, ch 2, 2 hbdc in next, hbdc in 12 (14) [16] {18} stitches, 2 hbdc in next, ch 2, 2 hbdc in next, hbdc in 12 (14) [16] {18} stitches, 2 hbdc in next, ch 2, 2 hbdc in next, hbdc in 12 (14) [16] {18} stitches, 2 hbdc in next, ch 2, 2 hbdc in next, hbdc in remaining stitches, join to first stitch with sl st (64 (72) [80] {88} dc)

Round 17: ch 2, turn, *hbdc in each stitch to the ch 2 space, (2 hbdc, ch 2, 2 hbdc) in ch 2 space* repeat from * to * around to last ch 2 space, hbdc in remaining stitches, join to first stitch with sl st (80 (88) [96] {104} dc)

Repeat round 17 to **Round 23 (24) [25] {26}** (176 (200) [224] {248} dc)

Round 24 (25) [26] {27}: ch 2, turn,
*hbdc in each stitch to ch 2 space,
hbdc in ch 2 space, ch 3, hbdc in
next ch 2 space (skipping the entire
sleeve portion)* Repeat from * to *
around, hbdc in remaining stitches,
join to first stitch with sl st (92 (104)
[116] {128} dc)



Round 25 (26) [27] {28}: ch 2, turn,
hbdc in each stitch and ch around, join to first stitch with sl st (98 (110) [122]
{134})

Round 26 (27) [28] {29}: ch 2, turn, hbdc in each stitch around, join to first
stitch with sl st (98 (110) [122] {134})

Repeat previous round to **Round 48 (51) [54] {57}**

Round 49 (52) [55] {58}: ch 1, turn, sc in each stitch around, join to first stitch
with sl st (98 (110) [122] {134})

Repeat previous round 2 more times.

Fasten off, weave in the ends.

SLEEVES

Join yarn to the bottom of an armhole

Round 1: ch 1, sc evenly around, join to first stitch with sl st

*Approx (51 (57) [63] {69} sc) stitches at the end of the round - this does not
have to be exact, if it's off by 1 or 2 that's ok*

Round 2: ch 2, turn, hbdc2tog, hbdc in each stitch around to last 2,
hbdc2tog, join to first stitch with sl st

Repeat round 2 to **Round 11**

Round 12: ch 2, turn, hbdc in each stitch around, join to first stitch with sl st

Repeat round 12 to **Round 32 (35) [38] {41}**

Round 33 (36) [39] {42}: ch 1, turn, *sc, sc2tog* repeat from * to * around, join to first stitch with sl st

Round 34 (37) [40] {43}: ch 1, turn, sc in each stitch around, join to first stitch with sl st

Repeat previous round 2 more times.

Fasten off, weave in the ends.

Repeat other sleeve.

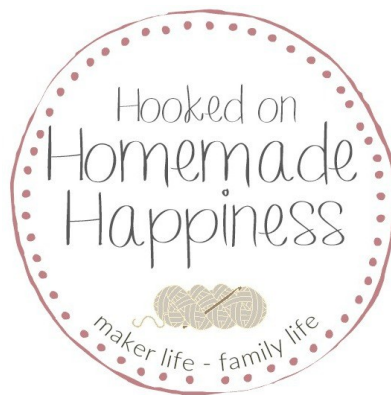
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
