Oh my velvety goodness. Are you ready for the comfiest, coziest sweater EVER?! This **Velvet Pullover Sweater Crochet Pattern** is so comfy you'll want to wear it all. the. time. That is not an exaggeration. It's made with all single crochet, so not only is it easy, but the stitches are small and make a solid, cozy piece of fabric. This sweater is long and loose. I love wearing it with with leggings (or jeans) and boots. It's the ultimate cozy outfit.

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Materials

Bernat Velvet (3 skeins for S/M, 4 skeins for L/XL)

J/6.0 mm hook

Yarn needle

scissors

Level

Easy -you must be very familiar with basic crochet stitches

Pattern notes & stitches to know

Sl st - slip stitch

Ch - chain

Sc - single crochet

Sc blo - single crochet back loop only

Sc2tog - single crochet 2 together (single crochet decrease)

Approximate Finished Size:

(size small pictured on 5'0" model)

Bust: S (40") M (43") L (46") XL (49")

Width across back: S (20") M (21.5") L (23") XL (24.5")

Length: S (26") M (27.5") L (29") XL (30.5")

Armhole: S (10") M (10.5") L (11") XL (11.5")

Sleeve: S (18") M (19") L (20") XL (21")

Gauge: 11 dc x 14 rows = 4"

VELVET PULLOVER SWEATER PATTERN

- Pattern starts with the ribbed band across the bottom
- Pattern written in S, M noted in (), L noted in [], XL noted in { }

FRONT

Ch 9

Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from the hook and across (8)

Row 2: ch 1, turn, sc in first, sc blo in next 6, sc in last (8)

Repeat row 2 to **Row 55 (59) [63] {67}**

Turn work so you are working across the long side of the ribbed band


Row 1: ch 1, sc in the end of each row across (55, (59), [63], {67})

Row 2: ch 1, turn, sc in each stitch across (55, (59), [63], {67})

Repeat row 2 to **Row 60**

The neckline begins in the next row and ends with 1 sc2tog

Row 61: ch 1, turn, sc in 26 (28) [30] {32} stitches, sc2tog (27, (29), [31], {33})



Row 62: ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in remaining stitches across (26, (28), [30], {32})

Row 63: ch 1, turn, sc across to last 2 stitches, sc2tog (25, (27), [29], {31})


Repeat last 2 rows to **Row 69** (19, (21), [23], {25})

Row 70: ch 1, turn sc in each stitch across (19, (21), [23], {25})

Repeat last row to **Row 78 (82) [86] {90}**

Fasten off, leave a long end for sewing

To make the other side of the neckline, join yarn to middle stitch in row 61 (the same stitch as the sc2tog from other side of the neckline)



Row 61: ch 1, sc2tog



sc in remaining stitches across (27, (29), [31], {33})

Row 62: ch 1, sc in each stitch to last 2, sc2tog (26, (28), [30], {32})

Row 63: ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in remaining stitches across (25, (27), [29], {31})

Repeat last 2 rows to **Row 69** (19, (21), [23], {25})

Row 70: ch 1, turn sc in each stitch across (19, (21), [23], {25})

Repeat last row to **Row 78 (82) [86] {90}**

Fasten off, leave a long end for sewing

BACK

Ch 9

Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from the hook and across (9)

Row 2: ch 1, turn, sc in first, sc blo in next 6, sc in last (9)

Repeat row 2 for **Row 55 (59) [63] {67}**

Turn work so you are working across the long side of the ribbed band

Row 1: ch 1, sc in the end of each row across (55, (59), [63], {67})

Row 2: ch 1, turn, sc in each stitch across (55, (59), [63], {67})

Repeat row 2 to **Row 78 (82) [86] {90}**

Fasten off.

SEWING

Lay the front on top of the back, wrong side out. Use the long end to sew the shoulders closed with a whip stitch

Sew the sides closed using a whip stitch leaving about a 10 (10.5) [11] {11.5} inch space at the top for arm holes




Fasten off, weave in the ends.

Turn right side out.

SLEEVES

Join yarn to bottom of arm hole



Round 1: ch 1, sc evenly around arm hole, join to first sc with sl st

Round 2: ch 1, sc2tog, sc around to last 2 stitches, sc2tog, join to first sc with sl st

Round 3 - 5: ch 1, sc around, join to first sc with sl st

Repeat round 2 - 5 to **Round 53 (56) [59] {62}**

Fasten off, weave in the ends.

Repeat other sleeve.


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
