The **Pulled Taffy Pullover Crochet Pattern** is a lightweight sweater that is perfect for fall and spring. It would also be fun for the holiday season! The stripes would be so cute in Christmas colors.

Materials

Lion Brand Touch of Mohair Gardenia (2 skeins for S, 3 skeins for M/L, 4 skeins for XL/2X, 5 skeins 3X), (1 skein each) Purple Haze, Mosaic Blue, and Lilac Rose

H/5.0 mm hook

yarn needle

scissors

Level

intermediate

Pattern notes & stitches to know

Stitches & Abbreviations - US terms

ch - chain

sc - single crochet

sc blo - single crochet back loop only

esc - extended single crochet (insert hook into stitch, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through one loop, yarn over, pull through two loops)

esc3tog - extended single crochet 3 together

esc2tog - extended single crochet 2 together

- written in US terms
- ch 1 does not count as sc
- ch 1 does not count as esc

Pattern notes cont.

- Gardenia is referred to as Color A, Lilac Rose is B, Mosaic Blue is C, Purple Haze is D
- Stripe pattern is *6 rows colors A, 2 rows color B, 1 row color A, 1 row color C, 1 row color A, 1 row color D* repeat from * to *
- Gauge: 14esc x 16 rows = 4" x 4"
- This sweater is made with two panels sewn together. Each panel starts at the bottom with the ribbed edging. Then the sleeves are made in turned rounds.
- This top is loose fitting with generous positive ease.

Sizes:

S, M, L, XL, 2X, 3X - The pattern is written in these sizes consecutively. Example, when the pattern gives the end of the row count as 85, 93, 101, 109, 117, 125, the 85 is for S, 93 for M, 101 for L, 109 for XL, 117 for 2X, and 125 for 3X

Approx Finished Size:

Bust: S (42") M (46") L (50") XL (54") 2X (58") 3X (62")

Length: S (19.5") M (21.5") L (23.5") XL (25.5") 2X (27.5") 3X (29.5")

Armhole: S (6") M (7") L (8") XL (9") 2X (10") 3X (11")

Sleeves: S (16") M (17") L (18") XL (19") 2X (20") 3X (21")

Size Small pictured. I'm 5'0" with 34" bust.

PULLED TAFFY PULLOVER CROCHET PATTERN

FRONT

Starting with Color A ch 11

Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from the hook and across (10 sc)

Row 2: ch 1, turn, sc in first stitch, sc blo in 8 stitches, sc in last (10)

Repeat row 2 to **Row 85, 93, 101, 109, 117, 125**

Now you will work across the long edge of the ribbing

Row 1: ch 1, turn, sc across, working 1 sc in the end of each row from the ribbing (85, 93, 101, 109, 117, 125 sc)

Row 2: ch 1, turn, esc in each stitch across (85, 93, 101, 109, 117, 125 esc)

Repeat row 2 to **Row 49, 53, 57, 61, 65, 69**

The neckline begins in the next row. You will only work halfway across the row and then turn.

Row 50, 54, 58, 62, 66, 70: ch 1, turn, esc in 40, 44, 48, 52, 56, 60 stitches, esc3tog (41, 45, 49, 53, 57, 61 esc)

Row 51, 55, 59, 63, 67, 71: ch 1, turn, esc3tog, esc in remaining stitches across (39, 43, 47, 51, 55, 59 esc)

Row 52, 56, 60, 64, 68, 72: ch 1, turn, esc in each stitch to the last 3, esc3tog (37, 41, 45, 49, 53, 57 esc)

Repeat previous 2 rows to **Row 58, 62, 66, 70, 74, 78** (25, 29, 33, 37, 41, 45 esc)

Row 59, 63, 67, 71, 75, 79: ch 1, turn, esc in each stitch across (25, 29, 33, 37, 41, 45 esc)

Repeat previous row to **Row 66, 74, 82, 90, 98, 106** (25, 29, 33, 37, 41, 45 esc)

Fasten off. Leave a long end for sewing.

Next, the other side of the neckline is made. Rejoin yarn to Row 50, 54, 58, 62, 66, 70 in the same stitch as the esc3tog.

Row 50, 54, 58, 62, 66, 70: ch 1, esc3tog, esc in remaining stitches (41, 45, 49, 53, 57, 61 esc)

Row 51, 55, 59, 63, 67, 71: ch 1, turn, esc in each stitch across to last 3, esc3tog 39, 43, 47, 51, 55, 59 esc)

Repeat previous 2 rows to **Row 58, 62, 66, 70, 74, 78** (25, 29, 33, 37, 41, 45 esc)

Row 59, 63, 67, 71, 75, 79: ch 1, turn, esc in each stitch across (25, 29, 33, 37, 41, 45 esc)

Repeat previous row to **Row 65, 73, 81, 89, 97, 105** (25, 29, 33, 37, 41, 45 esc)

Do not fasten off.

Sc evenly around the entire neckline to the opposite corner. (just on the front panel, photo was taken after sewing)

Fasten off. Leave a long end for sewing.

BACK

Starting with Color A ch 11

Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from the hook and across (10 sc)

Row 2: ch 1, turn, sc in first stitch, sc blo in 8 stitches, sc in last (10)

Repeat row 2 to **Row 85, 93, 101, 109, 117, 125**

Now you will work across the long edge of the ribbing

Row 1: ch 1, turn, sc across, working 1 sc in the end of each row from the ribbing (85, 93, 101, 109, 117, 125 sc)



Row 2: ch 1, turn, esc in each stitch across (85, 93, 101, 109, 117, 125 esc)

Repeat row 2 to **Row 65, 73, 81, 89, 97, 105** (85, 93, 101, 109, 117, 125 esc)

Fasten off. Leave a long end for sewing.

SEWING

Lay the front on top of the back panel. Use the long ends to sew the shoulders closed with a whip stitch.

Sew the sides closed with a whip stitch, leaving a 6", 7", 8", 9", 10", 11" opening at the top for armholes (optional: I left a small slit on the bottom of both sides)

Fasten off. Weave in the ends. Turn right side out.

SLEEVES

(stripe pattern is reversed for the sleeve as you are working from the top down)

Join Color A to the bottom of one armhole

Round 1: ch 1, esc evenly around the armhole, working 1 esc in the end of each row, join to first esc with sl st

Round 2: ch 1, turn, esc in each stitch around, join to first esc with sl st

Repeat round 2 to **Round 49, 53, 57, 61, 65, 69** (or until sleeve is approx 2" shorter than desired length)

Round 50, 54, 58, 62, 66, 70: ch 1, *esc in 2 stitches, esc2tog* repeat from * to * around, join to first esc with sl st

Round 51, 55, 59, 63, 67, 71: repeat previous round

Round 52, 56, 60, 64, 68, 72: ch 1, esc in each stitch around, join to first esc with sl st

CUFF

(the photos are from a different sweater, but the method is the same)

ch 9

Row 1: sc in 2nd ch from the hook and across, join to the last round of the sleeve with sl st (8 sc)

Row 2: sl st to the next stitch in the last round of the sleeve, sc in first stitch, sc blo in next 6 stitches, sc in last, (8)

Row 3: ch 1, turn, sc in first stitch, sc blo in next 6 stitches, sc in last, sl st to the last round of the sleeve (8)

Repeat rows 2 & 3 until you work all the way around the sleeve. Sew the cuff closed with a whip stitch

Fasten off. Weave in the ends.

Repeat for other sleeve.
