## Stitch Sampler Scrapghan CAL Part 5 - Diamond Stitch

## Materials

66g Worsted weight yarn + small amount for the border (the same color that will be used for sewing - optional)

H/5.0 mm hook

Yarn needle

Scissors

## Level

intermediate

## Pattern notes & stitches to know

ch – chain

sc - single crochet

dc - double crochet

fptr - front post treble crochet

fptr2tog - front post treble 2 tog

ws - wrong side

rs - right side

- written in US terms

- ch 1 does not count as sc **VIDEO TUTORIAL**

- ch 2 does count as dc **[How to Crochet the Diamond Stitch](#)**

- This stitch has a right side and wrong side

- This stitch requires a starting ch of a mult of 4 + 3

## Scrapghan Tips

- If you're having trouble getting the sizing right, remember that it's easier to adjust a square that's too small than one that's too big.
- If a square comes out too small you can add an additional round for the border, go up a hook size, and/or steam block and stretch the square to the size you want.
- The edges might curl. This can be fixed with some steam blocking. It won't be noticeable after sewing.
- Each square has at least 2 rounds of border. For the last round of the border I used the same color for each square (the dark gray). This is the same color used for the sewing.
- Each square does not need the same number of stitches for the border.
- Make 2 of each square. Alternatively, you can use cotton yarn and make 1 square to use as a dishcloth.

## ***PART 5 - DIAMOND STITCH (make 2)***

Ch 23 (ch mult 4 + 3)

**Row 1 (rs):** sc in 2nd ch from the hook and across (22 sc)

**Row 2 (ws):** ch 2, turn, dc in each stitch across (22 dc)

**Row 3 (rs):** ch 1, turn, fptr around the 3rd stitch in row 1, \*sc in next 3 stitches, fptr2tog (the first "leg" goes into the same stitch from previous fptr, skip 3 stitches, make second "leg" in next stitch)\* repeat from \* to \* across to last 2 stitches, fptr around final fptr, sc in last stitch

**Row 4 (ws):** ch 2, turn, dc in each stitch across (22 dc)

**Row 5 (rs):** ch 1, turn, sc in 2 stitches, \*fptr2tog (working around fptr and fptr2tog to make diamond shape), sc in next 3 stitches\* repeat from \* to \* across

**Row 6 (ws):** ch 2, turn, dc in each stitch across (22 dc)

**Row 7 (rs):** ch 1, turn, fptr around fptr2tog, sc in next 3 stitches, \*fptr2tog (to make diamond shape), sc in next 3 stitches\* repeat from \* to \* across to last 2 stitches, fptr around final fptr, sc in last

**Row 8 - 19:** repeat rows 4 - 7



## **BORDER**

*With the same color used for the square, work around the entire square (this stitch will have 3 rounds of border, add more if needed)*

**Round 1 (rs):** ch 1, sc along the side of the square, working 1 sc in the end of each sc row and 2 sc in each dc row across to the corner, ch 2, working along the bottom, sc in each stitch across to the corner, ch 2, working along the side, sc in the end of each sc row and 2 sc in each dc row across to the corner, ch 2, working along the top, sc in each stitch across to corner, ch 2, join to first sc with sl st

**Round 2 (rs):** ch 1, \*sc in each stitch across to ch-2 space, (sc, ch 2, sc) in ch-2 space\* repeat from \* to \* around, join to first sc with sl st

*Join to corner ch-2 space with border color*

**Round 2 (ws):** ch 1, sc in ch-2 space, sc in each stitch across to corner ch-2 space, \*(sc, ch 2, sc) in ch-2 space, sc in each stitch across to corner ch-2 space\* repeat from \* to \* around, (sc, ch 2) in last ch-2 space, join to first sc with sl st

Fasten off. Weave in the ends.

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
